together into one volume the most influential and commonly taught works of existentialism contributors include simone de beauvoir albert camus fyodor dostoevsky ralph ellison martin heidegger søren kierkegaard friedrich nietzsche jean paul sartre and miguel de unamuno y jugo

there are already many excellent books on existentialism some of them deal with particular problem or particular existentialist writers most of those that deal with existentialism as a whole divide their subject matter according to authors presenting chapters on kierkegaard heidegger sartre and the rest thus i think that there is room for the present book which attempts a comprehensive examination and evaluation of existentialism but does so by thematic treatment that is to say each chapter deals with a major theme of existentialist philosophy and these themes are

arranged in the order of the existential dialect of course each chapter is illustrated with material from the writings of existentialists from kierkegaard to camus

heidegger sartre and the later existentialist philosophers inherited a world it has been said from which god is absent contemporary philosophy begins in the momentous questioning of the christian experience by such nineteenth century figures as nietzsche and dostoyevsky but if existentialism is in some respects a beginning again it is in other respects linked to the classical world out of which christianity arose and to certain themes in the writings of ancient and medieval christians renewal and innovation converge addressing themselves to the general reader the three author philosophers consider both the contemporary and the perennial book jacket

the introduction gives the background of modern american drama which is a kind of slow evolution and has taken place in the form of an amalgamation of various schools it presents the gradual growth of the american dramatic literature right from eugene o neill up to edward albee this chapter includes the dramatists like eugene o neill maxwell anderson robert sherwood lillian hellman clifford odets philip barry tennessee williams arthur miller and edward albee in order to have an understanding of the overall development of the american dramatic literature in february 1915 an enthusiastic group of young amateurs calling themselves the washington square players waved a solemn manifesto in the face of new york drama critics they opened the band box theatre near the corner of 57th street and third avenue just a year and a half later another group equally young and enthusiastic took possession of a stable in macdougall street to be known thereafter as the province town theatre the dramatists of the washington square players were more influenced by ibsen shaw and maeterlinck whereas that of the province town group happened to accept eugene o neill as their torch bearer

this book collects original essays by top scholars that address questions about the nature origins and effects of ambivalence while the nature of agency has received an enormous amount of attention relatively little has been written about ambivalence or how it relates to topics such as agency rationality justification knowledge autonomy self governance well being social cognition and various other topics ambivalence presents unique questions related to many major philosophical debates for example it relates to debates about virtues rationality and decision making agency or authenticity emotions and social or political metacognition it is also relevant to a variety of larger debates in philosophy and psychology including nature vs nature objectivity vs subjectivity or nomothetic vs idiographic the essays in this book offer novel and wide ranging perspectives on this emerging philosophical topic they will be of interest to researchers and advanced students working in ethics epistemology philosophy of mind philosophy of psychology and social cognition
