life and the works by professors brown chambers chute rowse schoenbaum et al ad nauseam is and always has been as vladimir nabokov once put it in another context thirty two percent nonsense and fifty of neutral padding scottish author josephine tey called it tonypandy a nonsensical untrue story grown to legend and accepted by the public in the face of all evidence to the contrary michael h hart ph d in astrophysics princeton author of the 100 a ranking of the most influential persons in history i made a serious error in the first edition when without carefully checking the facts i simply followed the crowd and accepted the stratford man as the author of the shakespeare plays since then i have carefully examined the arguments on both sides of the question and have concluded that the weight of the evidence is heavily against the stratford man and in favor of de vere
